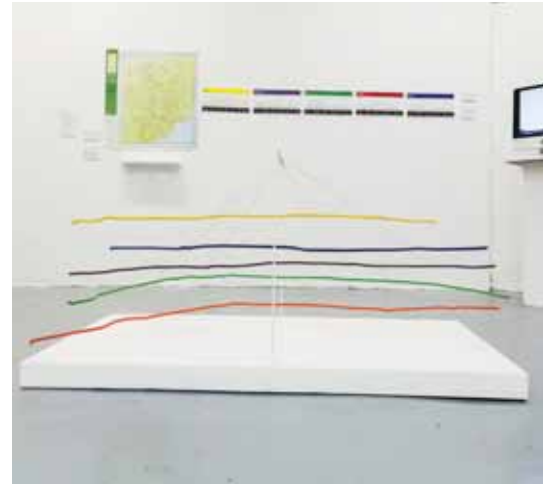

Chain Reaction

SIDNEY COOPER GALLERY, CANTERBURY

Chain Reaction is an exhibition that explores creative and scientific processes in response to the 30th anniversary of the invention of the Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR). This reaction is routinely performed by a humble box on the lab bench – the PCR machine. Scientists use it every day but rarely stop to think about it; most of the rest of us have never even heard of it. Yet it is the unsung hero of the genetic revolution behind police forensics, disease diagnosis, paternity testing and the human genome project. As such PCR forms an unexpected route into the heart of how scientists actually work in their laboratories.

Funded by the AHRC, six artists have been invited to engage with scientists from the University of Kent's School of Biosciences to learn what the PCR machine does, how it works and the impact it has had on society. Their artworks reveal the chain reactions occurring within PCR, between science and society, between scientists and artists – and who knows where next.

Ted Cante CBE was appointed by the Home Secretary to chair the Community Cohesion Review Team and to lead the review into the causes of the summer

disturbances of 2001. The ground-breaking 'Cante Report' was produced in December 2001.

Multicultural societies are increasingly the reality across the world. But multiculturalism no longer enjoys political nor popular support. Far Right and other forms of extremism are growing and identity politics are threatening national solidarity.

We need a new way of thinking about how we live together in an increasingly globalised world in which complex and multi-faceted identities are fast becoming the norm.

Professor Ted Cante will set out the theoretical and practical case for 'interculturalism' and explain how it provides a new and positive perspective for the future of social relationships.

2015 will see international celebrations to mark the 800th anniversary of Magna Carta, the great charter of liberties issued by King John at Runnymede on 15 June 1215.

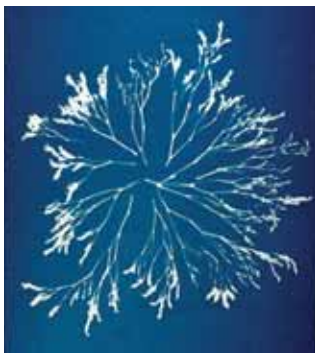

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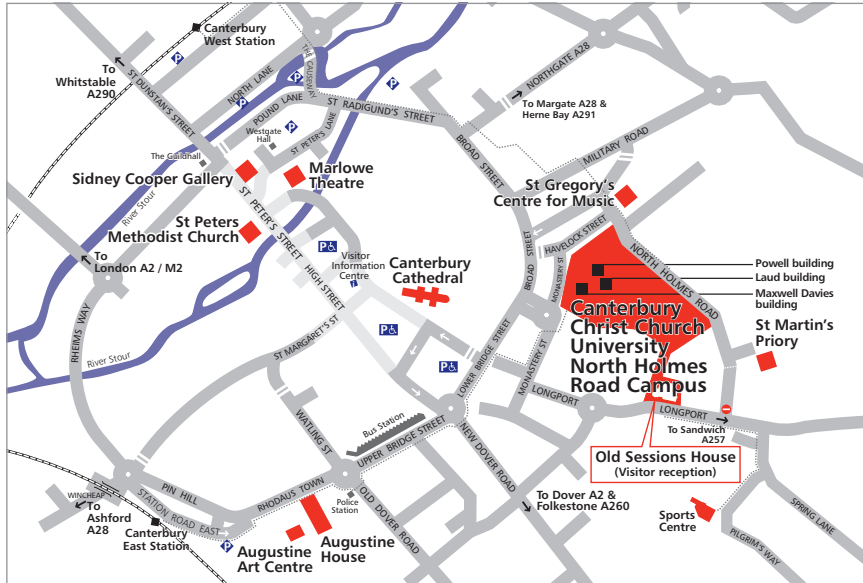

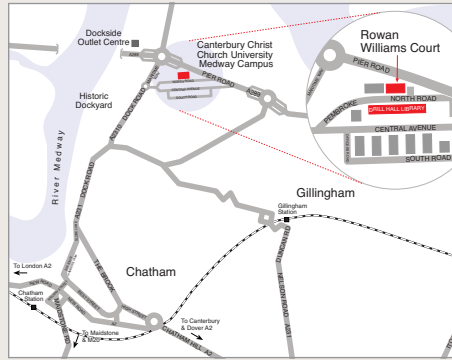
