### AWARD

- 1 The PGCE/ProfGCE will only be awarded when the School Centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT) setting has confirmed to the University that the student has met the Teachers' Standards.
- 2 To remain on the above awards students must pass all modules according to the requirements set out in these Additional Course Regulations.
- 3 Students who pass all the academic modules but do not meet Teachers' Standards will be awarded the relevant award; either the Pg Cert Primary Studies / Pg Cert Secondary Studies. These do not confer eligibility for recommendation for QTS by the SCITT.
- 4 The credit requirements and exit awards are as follows:

### QUALIFIED TEACHER STATUS

- 5 Students deemed by the SCITT to have met the Teachers' Standards will be recommended to the DfE for Qualified Teacher Status by the SCITT. The University is not responsible for making a recommendation to the DfE.
- 6 If successful in being recommended for the award of QTS the SCITT can and will award QTS irrespective of the PGCE or ProfGCE being passed or not.

### REASSESSMENT

- 7 Only one reassessment attempt is permitted per component of assessment.

### DUAL-LEVEL MODULES

- 8 Dual-level modules are permitted, the outcomes of which may either be at Level 7 or Level 6.
- 9 Each component of assessment has the outcome Pass/Not Pass and at Level 7 is also allocated a numerical mark for classification purposes.
- 10 The application of a late penalty will not take a Level 7 student into a Level 6 banding.

### CLASSIFICATION

- 11 The following awards are not classified:
  - (a) Prof GCE School Centred Initial Teacher Training (Primary Education)
  - (b) Prof GCE School Centred Initial Teacher Training (Secondary Education)
  - (c) Pg Cert Primary Studies
  - (d) Pg Cert Secondary Studies
- 12 The PGCE School Centred Initial Teacher Training (Primary Education) and PGCE School Centred Initial Teacher Training (Secondary Education) are classified as either Distinction, Merit or Pass:

- (i) For a Distinction a student must achieve an average mark of at least 70% across the two modules at Level 7, where neither of these modules has a module mark of lower than 60%.
- (ii) For a Merit, a student must achieve an average mark of between 60-69% across the two modules at Level 7, where neither of these modules has a module mark of lower than 50%.
- iii) All others will be classified as Pass.

## **MODULE ASSESSMENTS**

- 13 All components of assessment must be passed.
- 14 To pass a module at Level 7 all components of assessment must be passed at Level 7.
- 15 To pass a module at Level 6 all components must be passed and at least one component of assessment must be passed at Level 6.
- 16 Components of assessment marked at Level 7 will be given an individual, specific percentage mark. The pass mark is 50%.
- 17 At first attempt all components of assessment will be marked against the Level 7 criteria. Where it is determined that the Level 7 criteria have not been met, those components of assessment will be marked against Level 6 pass criteria and given an initial mark of 40% if these are met.
- 18 For all components of assessment that have not been passed at Level 7, a student will be offered reassessment at Level 7. After reassessment, where it is determined that the Level 7 criteria have not been met, components of assessment will be marked against Level 6 pass criteria and awarded 40% if these are met. Where a component of assessment was initially given a mark of 40% and the offer of reassessment at Level 7 was not taken, the Level 6 pass will then be awarded.
